4. Sanctioned post of different subjects should be mentioned on the basis of Roster. (Sec.-IV Sl. No. 14)
5. The no of teachers doing ph.D work should be mentioned and it should be reflected in a right way. (Sec-IV, Sl. No. 15)
6. The relevant audit-related information should be amassed from criterion-I to VII (separately) i.e the audit-related information from criterion-I/II/III etc should be searched categorically and then it should be mentioned.
 1. A significant increase in the number of research publication and paper presentation is expected in the days to come.
 2. Please mention in the next academic audit what kind of measures are particularly adopted in the institution to identify the slow learners.
 3. Getting structured feedback from the ~~faculties~~ faculties will stand the institutional policy makers in good stead.
